He has published articles and studies for the Georgetown Journal of International Affairs and the Council on Foreign Relations. His book, "People Are Not the Same: Leprosy and Identity in Twentieth-Century Mali," was awarded the Amaury Talbot Prize for African Anthropology by the Royal Anthropological Institute in 1998.
